2. RENOVATION STREAM

This financial assistance is intended to support the implementation of renovation projects primarily for:

- The rehabilitation of housing units that do not meet basic health and safety standards (e.g., units with mould growth or asbestos issues, high levels of radon, inadequate plumbing or other sanitations facilities, accessibility issues and other health and safety concerns).
- The rehabilitation of a building's major structural and mechanical elements that have reached the end of their useful life cycle (e.g., roofs, doors and windows, exterior sidings, etc.).
- Energy efficiency improvements.

Please note that:

- Health and safety projects will be given priority consideration.
- Energy efficiency needs will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis depending on the scope of the work and the availability of funding.
- > All cost overruns will be the responsibility of the Band Council.
- > Renovations must extend the structural or mechanical life expectancy of the housing unit.
- Work must meet or exceed the existing national and provincial building codes.

ELIGIBILITY

Eligible recipients:

Band Councils

Eligible for funding:

- Rental housing units belonging to the Band Council.
- On-reserve shelters for victims of family violence.
- Homes receiving funding under the CMHC's Residential Rehabilitation Assistance
 Program (RRAP) are eligible if the funding requested does not cover the same repairs.

Not eligible for funding:

- Individual privately-owned homes.
- Homes administered under an agreement pursuant to CMHC's On-Reserve Non-Profit Housing Program (section 95).
- Strictly aesthetic repairs and other non-structural or non-mechanical elements.
- Reimbursement of renovations completed in previous years that were not approved under this program.

PROPOSAL

Each community will be entitled to submit a renovation proposal for a maximum of 10 housing units per year. However, a community can submit a renovation proposal for more than 10 units as long as it can complete the project within ISC's maximum financial assistance limits (e.g., 10 housing units X \$28,000 = \$280,000) or with additional sources of funding.

To submit a proposal, you must:

- 1. Complete the Proposal Form

 - Project Location Plan
 - Work evaluation and estimates
 - *Health and Safety Inspection Reports can be attached to support the proposal, but they are not required.
